OFFICIAL PROCEEDINGS OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS MCKENZIE COUNTY, NORTH DAKOTA

January 5, 2016

The Board of Commissioners of McKenzie County, North Dakota met at the Commissioner's Room at the McKenzie County Courthouse in Watford City, North Dakota on January 5, 2016. Present: Commissioners Richard Cayko, Doug Nordby, Vawnita Best, and Kathy Skarda, Auditor Svihovec, Deputy Auditor Johnsrud, and State's Attorney Rodenbiker. Absent: Commissioner Ron Anderson. Chairman Cayko called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m.

Brad Solberg presented the Treasurer's Report for the period ending December 31, 2015. Recorder Johnsrud presented a proposal from S&S Motors for a 2014 Ford F150 pickup, trading in a 2009 GMC Acadia, for a net cost of \$17,000.00. Moved by Nordby, seconded by Skarda, to approve the Treasurer's Report, minutes, and bills, including vehicle purchase of \$17,000 to S&S Motors, as presented. All voting aye, motion carried.

Moved by Nordby, seconded by Best, to approve the Right of Way and Utility Corridor Easements with the City of Watford City, as presented, for IT 496 and Lot 1, Block 2 Peace and Justice Addition. All voting aye, motion carried.

Moved by Best, seconded by Skarda, to execute the Newfield Lease and Rider for Oil & Gas Lease in Lots 6, 7, 8, Block 3 of 4th Addition to Watford City, T150N, R98W. All voting aye, motion carried.

Moved by Nordby, seconded by Best, to approve the Pheasants Forever Raffle Permit application. All voting aye, motion carried.

The Board discussed the sale of County owned mobile homes and the Board consensus was to sell the units as is without repairs or cleaning. Moved by Skarda, seconded by Best, to authorize advertising the "as is" sale of six mobile homes at auction, by sealed bids; 125 Lincoln St., 125 Reagan St., 129 Lincoln St., 129 Reagan St., 137 Lincoln St., and 141 Lincoln St. All voting aye, motion carried.

Moved by Best, seconded by Skarda, to designate Emergency Manager, Karolin Jappe, as DES FEMA Applicant Agent. All voting aye, motion carried.

The Board discussed the possibility of recording meetings or streaming meetings live on the County website.

Moved by Nordby, seconded by Skarda, to approve three abatement applications as presented by Auditor Svihovec for corrections to valuations for abatement of a house

value on Lot 4-5-6, Block 2, Cherry Creek 2nd Addition and added to Lot 7-8-9, Block 2, Cherry Creek 2nd Addition; abate tax for duplicate assessment on IT 2477 pt NWSW; abate tax for duplicate assessment on IT 2383 pt NE¼ S8, T150N, R101W. All voting aye, motion carried.

PWD Kanwar updated the Board on the right of way acquisitions on the Northern Bypass Phase II.

Moved by Best, seconded by Skarda, to approve advertising for bid on the following equipment – Trucks, 4 or more motor graders. 1 or more loader, drum roller, patching trailer, water transports with a bid opening of January 21, 2016, and bid awarding of February 2, 2016. All voting aye, motion carried.

Highway Superintendent Dollinger requested authorization to piggy back on State bid for sand trucks. Auditor Svihovec and/or State's Attorney Rodenbiker will verify that counties can utilize State bids for purchasing sand trucks. Dollinger reported that the County road crew will be rebuilding Route 36 this spring and summer. It was the Board consensus that easements be obtained for right of way.

Commissioner Cayko asked for a motion to close the meeting and enter into Executive Session for attorney consultation on public domain royalty litigation pursuant to NDCC § 44-04-19.1. Moved by Best, seconded by Skarda, to move into Executive Session to discuss pending litigation. Roll call vote: Anderson, absent; Best, aye; Cayko, aye; Nordby, aye; Skarda, aye. Motion carried.

Executive Session began at 10:31 a.m. and was attended by Commissioners Best, Cayko, Nordby, Skarda; State's Attorney Rodenbiker; Deputy Auditor Johnsrud; Auditor Svihovec; Chief Assistant State's Attorney Todd Schwarz.

Executive Session was adjourned at 10:58 a.m. The public was invited to return to the meeting room and the meeting returned to open session. During Executive Session a motion was made to adopt the advice of the outside counsel.

Moved by Nordby, seconded by Skarda, to approve longevity bonus for three Social Services employees (Shelly Rogness, Sandy Meyer, and Karen Holte) on June 1, 2016, as proposed by HR Manager Willis to hold them at the same compensation as they received in 2015 and to review this bonus annually. All voting aye, motion carried.

Moved by Nordby, seconded by Skarda, to approve HR Manager Willis's request to reclassify four positions in the Recorder/Tax Director office from A12 to B21 with updated PDQs for a position titled Recording/Tax Specialist with an hourly rate

adjustment, effective the first pay period in January 2016. All voting aye, motion carried.

The meeting recessed for lunch at 11:38 a.m.

The meeting reconvened at 1:00 p.m.

Adam Parker, Sanford AirMed, presented a proposal for air ambulance service to the citizens of McKenzie County. Moved by Nordby, seconded by Skarda, to approve the Sanford AirMed contract for a 13 month period, December 1, 2015 through December 31, 2016, in the amount of \$31,968.00. All voting aye, motion carried.

Moved by Nordby, seconded by Skarda, to approve the contract with Zuercher Technologies, LLC, for a software license and service agreement in the amount of \$275,875.00. All voting aye, motion carried.

Commissioner Best stated that approval of this contract is not authorizing bringing 911 dispatch services back to the county. The Board would expect a full cost analysis on the process before they would consider making that change to current 911 dispatch services.

Captain Clock presented a proposal for Tahoes from three dealerships. The Board asked Clock to prepare a vehicle inventory along with the proposed number of vehicles that they plan to purchase and those that were going to be traded and bring to the next meeting.

Captain Clock requested approval for the purchase of a flight for Lt. Ken Rooks, who is working from Florida where he currently resides. Auditor Svihovec discussed that the typical process and policy was for an employee paying for travel related expenses up front and receiving reimbursement through the Travel Expense Reimbursement Voucher process, and explained that the current credit card policy does not allow for employee related travel usage, nor do any of the Auditor office employees have a credit limit high enough to pay for a plane ticket. The Board recognized the importance of Lt. Rook's attendance at the construction meeting. Moved by Nordby, seconded by Skarda, to authorize ICON Architectural Group to purchase flight for Lt. Ken Rooks for attendance to a Law Enforcement Center construction meeting, January 10-15, and to bill the county for the cost of the plane ticket with their regular monthly billing. All voting aye, motion carried.

Moved by Nordby, seconded by Best, to approve the Moving Reimbursement request for Lt. Ken Rooks per county policy, up to \$2,000.00, upon furnishing valid receipts. All voting aye, motion carried.

Captain Clock updated the Board on progress of both Jail and Sheriff Department's policies.

The meeting recessed at 3:02 p.m. until January 19, 2016, at 1:00 p.m.

The Board of Commissioners of McKenzie County, North Dakota met at the Commissioner's Room at the McKenzie County Courthouse in Watford City, North Dakota on January 19, 2016. Present: Commissioners Richard Cayko, Doug Nordby, Ron Anderson, Vawnita Best, and Kathy Skarda, Auditor Svihovec, Deputy Auditor Johnsrud, and State's Attorney Rodenbiker. Chairman Cayko called the meeting to order at 1:00 p.m.

Moved by Best, seconded by Nordby, to approve the Planning and Zoning Consent Agenda Items 1-6a-l as presented. All voting aye, motion carried. Item 1: Three Forks Industrial Park - Comp Plan Amendment/Zone Change; Item 2: Oasis Midstream Services – CUP; Item 3: Sacagawea Pipeline Company, LLC – CUP; Item 4: Chas and Kory Ophus – Variance; Item 5: Amendment for wastewater treatment facility; Item 6: Workforce Housing Sunset Clause—a. Aries Residential Suites sunset clause extended to 12/31/16, applicant to give a timeline of when they will be compliant with conditions of approval, as well as an exit strategy for the site. The 18 units approved but not on site were also approved; b.Delmer Rink CUP for additional housing expired; c. Delta Constructors applicant has 1 month to give timeline for compliance, units that are not currently on site will not be approved without obtaining a new CUP; d. Duane Lobbestael CUP for housing expired; e. Fertile Fields applicant to give an exit strategy, 12 units applied for but not on site are no longer approved without obtaining a new CUP; f. Indian Hills Disposal CUP for workforce housing is revoked, all housing needs to be either removed or they need to reapply (no skids or RV's will be allowed); q. HR Manager Willis presented a request for J. Smith to donate 16 hours of sick leave to J. Smith. Moved by Nordby to approve the donation. The motion died for lack of a second. The request was denied.

Moved by Anderson, seconded by Nordby, to authorize Highway Superintendent Dollinger to advertise for 5 million gallons of magnesium chloride. All voting aye, motion carried.

Moved by Anderson, seconded by Skarda, to approve a letter in support of bike trail in conjunction with the Highway 85 four-lane project. All voting aye, motion carried.

Moved by Anderson, seconded by Nordby, to approve the refund of \$3,481.36 building permit fee to Western Area Water Supply for Permit #15-0095M as requested by PWD Kanwar and in keeping with the verbal agreement the County shares with WAWSA for in-kind services. All voting aye, motion carried.

Moved by Nordby, seconded by Anderson, to authorize advertising for bid for pavement and reconstruction of the Northern Bypass Phase II paving project. All voting aye, motion carried.

Moved by Best, seconded by Nordby, to approve the purchase of seven vehicles per bid as presented at the January 5, 2016, meeting, utilizing Law Enforcement grant funds. All voting aye, motion carried. The Board denied the request for two additional vehicles.

The Sheriff's Department presented year end statistical reports with data on call numbers.

Commissioner Best left the meeting at 4:10 p.m.

Jeff Melgaard, Construction Engineers, Inc., updated the Board on company restructure and plans going forward.

Moved by Anderson, seconded by Skarda, to approve the proposal from Eide Bailly for accounting services for the Water Resource District financial records for 2013, 2014, and 2015. All voting aye, motion carried.

Moved by Nordby, seconded by Anderson, to publish the 2016 salaries/wages in the McKenzie County Farmer. All voting aye, motion carried.

Moved by Skarda, seconded by Nordby, to appoint Kris Mrachek and Les Haugen to the McKenzie County Planning & Zoning Board with 4 year terms expiring January 31, 2020. All voting aye, motion carried.

Moved by Nordby, seconded by Anderson, to have HR Manager Willis obtain a proposal from Fox Lawson to provide additional consultation on the salary and wage classification system. All voting aye, motion carried.
