BE PREPARED

2. **BUILD A KIT** - AFTER YOU MADE YOUR PLAN, BUILD AN EMERGENCY KIT, AND/OR A WINTER SURVIVAL KIT FOR YOUR CAR.
3. **KEEP INFORMED** - WATCH WEATHER ALERTS, GET ROAD REPORTS, INFORM OTHERS OF YOUR PLANS.

SEVERE SUMMER WEATHER

Severe Weather Hazards

 Tornado	Tornadoes are violently rotating columns of air that can destroy buildings and cause significant injury or death ACTION: Take shelter immediately in a sturdy structure
 Large Hail	Hail can damage vehicles, crops, buildings, and cause injuries ACTION: Move indoors away from windows
 Strong Wind	Strong wind can knock over trees and damage buildings ACTION: Move indoors away from windows
 Heavy Rain	Heavy rain can cause flash flooding and wash out roads ACTION: Avoid rising creeks and water-covered roads
 Lightning	Lightning strikes can cause significant injury or death ACTION: Move indoors if you hear thunder

WHAT IS EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT?

Emergency Management is an ongoing effort to keep you, the residents of McKenzie County, SAFE!

Emergency management seeks to promote safer, less vulnerable communities with the capacity to cope with hazards and disasters.

That is accomplished through:

Mitigation – Activities taken to reduce the severity or consequences of an emergency.

Preparedness – Those activities, programs, and systems that exist prior to an emergency that are used to support and enhance response to an emergency or disaster.

Response – Those actions taken to save lives and protect property during an emergency event.

Recovery – The process of restoring community infrastructure and social and economic systems following an emergency or disaster.

BE PREPARED, KNOW BEFORE YOU GO!

1. ALWAYS CHECK THE WEATHER AND ROAD REPORTS BEFORE YOU TRAVEL AND TELL SOMEONE YOUR PLANS
2. BE SURE TO DRESS FOR COLD WEATHER, ADD LAYERS AS NEEDED, WEAR GLOVES, FACEMASK, WARM BOOTS, AND A HAT
3. ALWAYS DRINK PLENTY OF FLUIDS
4. KEEP A WINTER SURVIVAL KIT IN YOUR CAR
